

Construction of toilets for a remote primary school

Project Reference: Wa20_250

► How will this project help?

This school is in a very remote area of Western Nepal . The school has only one toilet for over 150 students. It is located some distance from the school building, and does not have any running water. As a result, many children do not use the toilet building. This is very bad for the environment, and leads to many sanitation problems. Furthermore, due to the lack of basic toilet facilities, some children choose not to go to school. Your support for this project will help create a healthy environment for the students, and encourage children to attend school.

► Cost of Project

Costs are given in the local currency, Nepalese Rupees (NRS). This is because all items are bought locally in Nepal to reduce costs and to support the local economy.

Cost breakdown

Materials:

Cement: 35 x 600 NRS = 21000 NRS

Iron Rod: 150 x 52 NRS = 7800 NRS

Fittings: = 5000 NRS

Skilled Labour: 25 people x 250 NRS = 6250 NRS

Project Implementation costs = 3200 NRS

Local bank charges to receive funds = 350 NRS

Local contribution:

Sand = 6000NRS. NRS

Wood = 5000 NRS

Stone =5000 NRS

Gravel =9000 NRS

Unskilled labour: 100 people x 150 NRS =15,000 NRS

Transportation costs = 4000 NRS

Total cost of project in local currency =
43500 Nepalese Rupees

► **Total Cost of Project in Pounds = 362.50**

(JustAid is currently using an exchange rate of £1 = 120 Nepalese Rupees. This rate is slightly lower than the Banks because it allows for fluctuation in the rates)

- ◆ Population: 23.1 million
- ◆ Average annual income: US\$ 220
- ◆ Often described as the “country of villages” with over 80 % of the population living in over 40,000 villages, some of which are located in remote mountainous regions.
- ◆ Only 28% of the population have access to adequate sanitation
- ◆ Every year 35,000 children still lose their lives due to diarrhea.
- ◆ 76% of adult females are illiterate
